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Introduction

As a result, we would like to inform you regarding the way we would use your Personal data. We recommend you read this Privacy Notice and Consent so that you understand our approach towards the use of your Personal data. By submitting your Personal data to us, you will be treated as having given your permission — where necessary and appropriate — for disclosures referred to in this policy. By using this web site or service and products from IT Event Management, you acknowledge that you have reviewed the terms of this Privacy Notice and Consent to Use of Personal data (the "Privacy Notice and Consent") and agree that we may collect, use and transfer your Personal data in accordance therewith.

If you do not agree with these terms, you may choose not to provide any Personal data, but this may impact on our ability to support you as a customer or supplier. This Privacy Notice and Consent forms part of our Terms and Conditions of Use and such shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the relevant laws. This Notice explains how we obtain, use and disclose your personal data, as is required by the General Data Protection Regulation. At IT EVENT MANAGEMENT we are committed to protecting your privacy impact and to ensure that your Personal data is collected and used properly, lawfully and openly.

Who we are?

IT Event Management (IT-EM) was founded in 2002 by a group of young, energetic university graduates who wanted to change the face of events management in South Africa.

Consequently, they set about developing a range of state-of-the-art IT solutions aimed at the events and exhibitions market. By designing unique, customised, easy-to-use systems and programmes, IT-EM provides cost-effective IT solutions for any event, exhibition, conference, gala dinner or meeting.

Because all services are provided on site, IT-EM ensures that organisers of these events can sit back and relax while every technological component – from registration and delegate tracking to internet connectivity and plasma displays – is taken care of professionally.

The data we collect

Collection of Personal data

We collect and process your Personal data mainly to provide you with access to our services and products, to help us improve our offerings to you, to support our contractual relationship with you and for certain other purposes explained below. The type of data we collect will depend on the purpose for which it is collected and used. We will only collect data that we need for that purpose.

We collect data directly from you where you provide us with your personal details, for example when you purchase or supply a product or services to or from us or when you submit enquiries to us or contact us. Where possible, we will inform you what data you are required to provide to us and what data is optional.

Examples of data we collect from you are:

- name
- address
- email address
- telephone/cell number
- Government ID/Passport Details
- Medical and disability
- Gender
- Foto's and other biometric data
- user-generated content, posts and other content you submit to our web site

We also collect data about you from other sources as explained below:

Data contained in CRM, Marketing, Accounts and Exhibition and event specific Databases received from our clients (typically event organizers) in their role as the Responsible party (Controller).

With your consent, we may also supplement the data that you provide to us with data we receive from other companies in our industry in order to offer you a more consistent and personalized experience in your interactions with IT EVENT MANAGEMENT.

Collection of Non-Personal data

We may automatically collect non-Personal data about you such as the type of internet browsers you use or the website from which you linked to our website. We may also aggregate details which you have submitted to the site (for example, the products or services you are interested in). You cannot be identified from this data and it is only used to assist us in providing an effective service on this web site. We may from time to time supply third parties with this non-personal or aggregated data for uses in connection with this website.

Cookies policy

We use the term "cookies" to refer to cookies and other similar technologies covered by the POPI Act on privacy in electronic communications.

What is a cookie?

Cookies are small data files that your browser places on your computer or device. Cookies help your browser navigate a website and the cookies themselves cannot collect any data stored on your computer or your files. When a server uses a web browser to read cookies, they can help a website deliver a more user-friendly service. To protect your privacy, your browser only gives a website access to the cookies it has already sent to you.

Why do we use cookies?

We use cookies to learn more about the way you interact with our content and help us to improve your experience when visiting our website. Cookies remember the type of browser you use and which additional browser software you have installed. They also remember your preferences, such as language and region, which remain as your default settings when you revisit the website. Cookies also allow you to rate pages and fill in comment forms. Some of the cookies we use are session cookies and only last until you close your browser, others are persistent cookies which are stored on your computer for longer.

How are third party cookies used?

For some of the functions within our websites we use third party suppliers, for example, when you visit a page with videos embedded from or links to YouTube. These videos or links (and any other content from third party suppliers) may contain third party cookies and you may wish to consult the policies of these third-party websites for data regarding their use of cookies.

• How do I reject and delete cookies?

We will not use cookies to collect personally identifiable data about you. However, should you wish to do so, you can choose to reject or block the cookies set by the websites of any third-party suppliers by changing your browser settings – see the Help function within your browser for further details. Please note that most browsers automatically accept cookies so if you do not wish cookies to be used you may need to actively delete or block the cookies.

How we use your data

We will use your Personal and Non-Personal data only for the purposes for which it was collected or agreed with you, for example:

- RSVP Management of a Client Event/Exhibition/Roadshow
- Onsite Registration at Client Event/Exhibition/Roadshow
- Provision of Matchmaking Services
- Communications of Above including newsflashes and invitations and support
- Analyse the effectiveness of our advertisements, competitions and promotions
- Collect data about the device you are using to view the site, such as your IP address or the type of Internet browser or operating system you are using, and link this to your Personal data so as to ensure that the site presents the best web experience for you
- Evaluate the use of the site, products and services
- For audit and record keeping purposes
- For market research purposes
- For monitoring and auditing site usage
- Help speed up your future activities and experience on the site. For example, a site can recognise that you have provided your Personal data and will not request the same data a second time.
- In connection with legal proceedings
- Make the site easier to use and to better tailor the site and our products to your interests and needs
- Offer you the opportunity to take part in competitions or promotions
- Personalise your website experience, as well as to evaluate (anonymously and in the aggregate) statistics on website activity, such as what time you visited it, whether you've visited it before and what site referred you to it
- Suggest products or services (including those of relevant third parties) which we think may be of interest to you
- To assist with business development
- To carry out our obligations arising from any contracts entered into between you and us.
- To conduct market or customer satisfaction research or for statistical analysis
- To confirm and verify your identity or to verify that you are an authorised customer for security purposes
- To contact you regarding products and services which may be of interest to you, provided you
 have given us consent to do so or you have previously requested a product or service from us
 and the communication is relevant or related to that prior request and made within any
 timeframes established by applicable laws.
- To notify you about changes to our service
- To respond to your queries or comments

- We will also use your Personal data to comply with legal and regulatory requirements or industry codes to which we subscribe, or which apply to us, or when it is otherwise allowed by law.
- Where we collect Personal data for a specific purpose, we will not keep it for longer than is
 necessary to fulfil that purpose, unless we must keep it for legitimate business or legal
 reasons. In order to protect data from accidental or malicious destruction, when we delete
 data from our services, we may not immediately delete residual copies from our servers or
 remove data from our backup systems.
- You can opt out of receiving communications from us at any time. Any direct marketing communications that we send to you will provide you with the data and means necessary to opt out.

Disclosure of Personal data

We may disclose your Personal data to our business partners who are involved in the delivery of products or services to you. We have agreements in place to ensure that they comply with these privacy terms.

We may share your Personal data with, and obtain data about you from:

- Third parties for the purposes listed above;
- Other companies in our industry when we believe it will enhance the services and products, we can offer to you, but only where you have not objected to such sharing;
- Other third parties from whom you have chosen to receive marketing data.

We may also disclose your data:

- Where we have a duty or a right to disclose in terms of law or industry codes;
- Where we believe it is necessary to protect our rights.

Personal data Security

We are legally obliged to provide adequate protection for the Personal data we hold and to stop unauthorised access and use of personal data. We will, on an on-going basis, continue to review our security controls and related processes to ensure that your Personal data is secure.

Our security policies and procedures cover:

- Acceptable usage of personal data;
- Access to personal data;
- Computer and network security;
- Governance and regulatory issues;
- Investigating and reacting to security incidents.
- Monitoring access and usage of personal data;
- Physical security;
- Retention and disposal of data;
- Secure communications;
- Security in contracting out activities or functions;

When we contract with third parties, we impose appropriate security, privacy and confidentiality obligations on them to ensure that Personal data that we remain responsible for, is kept secure.

We will ensure that anyone to whom we pass your Personal data agrees to treat your data with the same level of protection as we are obliged to.

Access to your Personal data

You have the right to request a copy of the Personal data we hold about you. To do this, simply contact us at the numbers/addresses listed on our home page and specify what data you would like. We will take all reasonable steps to confirm your identity before providing details of your personal data.

Please note that any such access request may be subject to a payment of a legally allowable fee, as laid down in our POPI Act Policy.

Correction of your Personal data

You have the right to ask us to update, correct or delete your personal data. We will take all reasonable steps to confirm your identity before making changes to Personal data we may hold about you. We would appreciate it if you would take the necessary steps to keep your Personal data accurate and upto-date by notifying us of any changes, we need to be aware of.

Definition of Personal data

According to the POPI Act "Personal data" means data relating to an identifiable, living, natural person, and where it is applicable, an identifiable, existing juristic person.
